## **ANCIENT RITUAL**

This programmatic work depicts a primitive rite in sound. Cast in three sections, the piece uses contemporary harmonies and colorful percussion to display the moods and energies of a long-ago ceremony.

#### **LEARNING OBJECTIVES**

The ability to understand and project programmatic ideas in sound is an important part of musical training. Stress the drama and power of the melodies and harmonies – most notably, the tone clusters in the slow section.

#### **MUSIC THEORY**

Explain and demonstrate:

- 1. canonic entries (measure 19) like a "round."
- 2. polyphonic texture (measures 11-18)
- 3. minor scales
- 4. tone clusters (measures 39, 42 & 46)
- 5. triads & seventh chords (measure 27)

Key: Concert F minor. Learn the following scale and arpeggio, which is printed at the top of each player's part



#### Time Signature:

4/4 - The upper number indicates there are four beats to a measure; the lower number indicates a quarter note receives one beat.

#### Style Markings:

accent (>) - a heavy, separated style; a sudden emphasis on a note or chord,

Adagio - slow.

Con Brio - with brilliance.

marc. - the abbreviation for the Italian word marcato, which means marked or well pronounced; play with separation.

#### **Dynamic Markings:**

piano (p) – soft.

mezzo piano (mp) - moderately soft.

mezzo forte (mf) – moderately loud.

forte (f) – loud.

forte piano (fp) - start note loudly (forte), and immediately get soft.

crescendo ( ) – gradually grow louder.

decrescendo or diminuendo ( ) – gradually grow softer.

#### **Other Musical Terms:**

Tempo I - return to the original tempo or speed.
